

# CHRISTIAN MODEL MINISTRIES REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH 2025

Dear friends and co-workers in Christ,

We thank the Lord for what he has done through the Christian Model Ministries (CMM) during the month of March.

Below are some of the highlights of what has been going on in CMM during this month.

#### 1. PRISON MINISTRY

Prison ministry has been a blessing to our ministry. We visited the following prisons;

## a) Isingiro Prison

Isingiro District Prison is located approximately 20 minutes' drive from Mbarara City, along the Kikagati–Mbarara road. The facility houses 403 inmates, of whom 380 are men. The prison administration granted us access to spread the Gospel.

We donated five sewing machines along with related materials to support the training of inmates in tailoring skills. The sewing machines will be used to train approximately 200 inmates, with the hope of equipping them with sewing machines upon their release.

# b) Nyabirongo Prison

Nyabirongo Prison is located in Kisinga Sub County, Kasese District. Currently, a member of the CMM staff serves as the resident pastor, ministering to the prisoners. Having services outdoors posed some challenges during extreme weather conditions so we provided materials for the construction of a church shelter. The structure is currently under construction, and we look forward to it becoming fully operational later this month.

# 2. CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

Our focus was on reaching primary schools across various districts for different reasons, including:

**Preaching the Word:** We shared the Gospel with young people, and many accepted the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

**School Outreaches:** We visited primary schools in multiple districts, extending the love of Christ to both students and staff.

Community Engagement: We actively engaged with local communities, fostering relationships

and laying the groundwork for continued ministry.

#### 3. YOUTH MINISTRY

As part of our outreach efforts, we visited several secondary schools, engaged with youth and shared the Gospel. As a result, many young people have accepted Christ as their Lord and Saviour.

**Youth Church Planting:** We have established a team of young believers who are passionate about spreading the Gospel. This team has been instrumental in reaching out to their peers and sharing the love of Christ.

**Salvation Testimonies:** New converts' testimonies are a testament to God's transformative power, and we are grateful for the opportunity to disciple them.

## 4. MEN'S FELLOWSHIP

# 5. GOAT REARING PROJECT

As part of our empowerment initiative aimed at promoting income-generating activities, we

supported 10 families by providing them with goats, hens, and piglets as start-up capital for their small-scale businesses. We know that this support will enable them to generate income to meet household needs and contribute toward their children's education.

Note: These 10 families also established a savings group to help them manage and save money for future needs.

#### 6. MINISTRY IN KARAMOJA

A variety of impactful activities were carried out in Karamoja. Below is a summary of what transpired:

**Training of Sunday School Teachers:** Sunday School teachers received training on how to effectively preach and teach children across various age groups. The training also included guidance on praying for the children under their care and the use of visual aids to enhance the learning experience.

**Follow-up on a Family Livelihood Project:** We conducted a follow-up visit to Mary, who oversees a piggery project that we supported with start-up capital last year. Despite the

challenges of the current hot season and food scarcity, Mary's project is thriving and continues to provide for her family.

**Distribution of Sewing Kits:** Sewing machines that were provided by our esteemed TUPS friends and partners, were distributed to widows who attend church. This approach allows for easier follow-up and additional training, should the recipients require further support in using the sewing kits.

**Distribution of Gifts from TUPS:** Clothing donations received from TUPS were distributed to children, who were delighted to receive the gifts. Their parents and guardians also expressed heartfelt joy in seeing their children well-dressed. We extend our sincere gratitude to everyone who contributed to supporting these families.

Below are the different activities that took place in Karamoja. These include distributing clothing to children, giving parents food, teaching Sunday school teachers how best to teach children about God using visual materials, and also the different piggery projects in the region.



















# 7. THE CHURCH BASED TRAINING IN BIBLICAL STUDIES (C-TBS)

We are currently conducting three New Testament classes at three locations: Uganda Polymath Technical Institute which is under Odyssey Technologies, Searchlight of God Church - Matugga, and Mukono Deliverance Church.

The class at Mukono Deliverance Church is currently studying the book of Ephesians. With the class having pastors and church leaders from various congregations, they testified that this Bible study approach has already enhanced their church Bible study sessions and simplified the preparation of Sunday school sermons. Glory to God!

Uganda Polymath Technical Institute and Searchlight of God Church - Matugga are studying the Gospel according to Luke. Pastors and ministers attending classes expressed their gaining of deeper insights into the Scriptures through the use of the inductive Bible study method.
